Explanation of Point Values (using Criteria out of 15 for a 70% Pass as example):

Criteria Out of 15 (70% Pass)	0	3 1 – 5	8 6 – 10	10.5	11.5 11 – 12	13.5 13 – 14	15	15
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Course Pass Grade is **70%**;
Chosen Criteria has a total point value of **15**.

The **bolded single number** at the top is used to set the point value for the level in eConestoga's Rubric Tool. This will be the default point value when that level is selected while grading.

The range provided underneath is optional, and used when faculty are prepared to override the set value (above) while grading in eConestoga. This range does provide greater opportunity for point differentiation within a particular level.

The **Incomplete (Zero)** and **Exceptional (Perfect)** levels are included in the rubric to ensure that only students demonstrating exceptionalism will receive a perfect score, and that students not completing or submitting work will receive a zero. There does not need to be a description for these levels. This supports a reduction in grade inflation.
